

# A Reminder: HWLincs is now one of the good causes listed with the South and East Lincolnshire Community Lottery

#### How to lottery works

South and East Lincolnshire Community Lottery is a weekly lottery that raises money for good causes in South and East Lincolnshire. All good causes supported by the lottery will benefit South and East Lincolnshire and its residents.

Tickets for the lottery cost just £1 a week. Each ticket has a **1 in 50** chance to win a prize each week, with a top prize of £25,000! That's a better chance of winning than the National Lottery or the Health Lottery.

Each ticket has six numbers and each number is between 0 and 9. There will be a draw every Saturday night when a six-digit winning combination will be picked. Prizes will be given to players with tickets that match the first or last 2 to 6 numbers from the winning combination. Match all six and you win the jackpot!

#### How will HWLincs benefit

As 60% of all ticket sales go to good causes, HWLincs decided to register as one of the good causes that might benefit. Any funds raised by HWLincs through this new lottery will go towards developing new outreach support for our Healthwatch Information Signposting Service, by providing advice and information for locally families, individuals and communities across South and East Lincolnshire.



#### **Cost-of-living: Quick Poll Survey**

The cost-of-living survey will be launching in January and will be supported by a cost-of-living support pack. This pack will contain information, for example, on foodbanks in the area, hygiene banks, financial support, community hubs and warm spaces. Watch this space for our launch in January.

#### **Enter and View**

Next year we will begin a series of Enter and View activities Healthwatch has the legal power to visit health and social care services and see them in action. This power to "Enter and View" services allow us to identify what is working well and where improvements could be made. These will include:

- Mystery shopper, Enter and View activity across our Lincolnshire hospitals and A&E departments.
- Supporting LPFT at 2 inpatient wards
- Working with LCC & CQC to visit Lincolnshire Care homes
- Working with LCC focusing on designing a survey exploring food and nutrition in a residential care home for those with learning disabilities.

As some of our existing contracts have come to an end, we are now focussed on what's next. Working with local and national colleagues to continue our successful 2022 by being involved in work which focuses on the aims and objectives of HWLincs, that being an organisation which can provide engagement and insight to improve services and experiences of our local and indeed nation populations in terms of wellbeing.

**Most recently we have concluded our MSK work**, feedback has been fantastic on this work and we were pleased to hear from our NHS colleagues who said, "Thank you for the second report. It will be circulated widely across our stakeholders. The areas highlighted have been noted and it is something we will be working on going forwards.

It's been lovely working with you and HWLincs for 'making it happen'."
